Phil McHenry has worked in various capacities within rehabilitation for over 15 years. He began in 2008 as a therapy aide in outpatient spinal cord rehabilitation in the NeuroRecovery Network. During that time, he assisted in providing locomotor training for individuals with incomplete spinal cord injuries. He trained staff in the same intervention and assisted with related research projects. In 2016 he earned his PTA license and later moved into his current clinical role in outpatient orthopedics. Phil comes from an academic background in English, earning his master's degree from Ohio State in 2008. His academic work revolved around narrative analysis, critical engagement with various forms of storytelling (literary, graphic, cinematic, etc.), and the ways in which texts both shape and reflect personal and collective perspectives. His presentation on narrative medicine caters to his combined experience and studies on the intersection of clinical care and storytelling.
