#### Impact on significant health needs identified in HealthMap2016 OSU Wexner Health Improvement Plan

The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center has one overarching goal: we're committed to improving people's lives and the health of the Franklin County population. As an academic medical center, we approach health needs through research, patient care and education both of the public and future caregivers about the importance of community health. While much of this work occurs within Ohio State's facilities, we touch thousands of central Ohioans every year where they live, in neighborhoods around the city.

As a member of the Central Ohio Hospital Council, Ohio State Wexner Medical Center collaborates with other health systems and community organizations. That collaboration includes our participation—beginning in 2013—in the Franklin County HealthMap in partnership with the Central Ohio Hospital Council, OhioHealth, Mount Carmel Health System, Nationwide Children's Hospital, Columbus Public Health, United Way of Central Ohio, The Ohio State University College of Public Health, Central Ohio Trauma System, Franklin County Public Health, PrimaryOne Health, Heart of Ohio Family Health Centers, Ohio Department of Aging, Ohio Department of Health, Ohio Disability and Health Program, Health care for the Homeless, Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging, and Lower Lights Christian Health Center. The collaborative effort aims to gain a comprehensive knowledge of the greatest health needs of our immediate community. HealthMap 2013 and 2016 are instrumental in driving a supplementary strategic approach to health improvement. The strategic process involves the continual collection and analysis of data on health status and factors contributing to poor health and collaboration with diverse stakeholders to address both the symptoms and underlying causes of health issues.

Chio State Wexner Medical Center and its health sciences colleges—the College of Medicine, College of Dentistry, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Optometry, School of Health and Rehabilitation Science, College of Social Work, and College Public Health—have an extraordinary opportunity to partner on issues of prevention and community health. We are focusing on the ultimate mission of *improving health* by establishing partnerships in the community to address the diverse factors determining health—in local communities, the state and globally. Guided by the Franklin County HealthMap as well as the State of Ohio's Health Improvement Plan (SHIP), strategies we focus on include Access to Care, Infant Mortality and Materna Health, Chronic Conditions, Obesity, Mental Health and Addiction and Infectious Diseases. We also focus on social determinants of health like student success, economic vitality, public policy, food insecurity, safe dirty needle disposal, health career recruitment program, healthy eating and smoking cessation.

This spreadsheet outlines the various programs we offer and/or participate in to make improvements in all of the areas outlined above to ultimately improve the lives of everyone in our community.
