

Our ambition: To be a top 20 academic health center driving breakthrough health care solutions that transform people's lives and the communities in which we live.

As one of the largest and most diverse academic medical centers in the country, we've always been on the leading edge of education, discovery and patient care — and now we're going even further.

The Ohio State Wexner Medical Center, part of one of the most comprehensive health sciences campuses in the country and the only academic medical center in central Ohio, is at the forefront of medicine. Here, discovery and innovation in our research laboratories translate to unique and effective therapies — available to patients well before they reach other hospitals.

These initiatives take place across our vast health care platform: within the Ohio State College of Medicine, at more than a dozen affiliated research centers and inside seven hospitals, where more than 60,000 inpatients receive medical care annually.

In addition, we have a unified physician practice, representing more than 1,700 preeminent physicians, and a network of community-based primary and subspecialty care facilities that manage more than 1 million patient visits each year. We offer health care services in virtually every specialty and subspecialty in medicine. Thousands of patients come to us each month for treatments and services they can't find anywhere else.



The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center – Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Richard J. Solove Research Institute (OSUCCC - James)

The OSUCCC – James strives to create a cancer-free world by integrating research with excellence in education and patient-centered care. Ohio State is a National Cancer Institute (NCI)-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center, a designation competitively maintained since 1976, and is one of only a few centers funded by the NCI to conduct phase I, II and III clinical trials on novel anticancer drugs provided by the NCI.

As the cancer program's 356-bed adult patient care component, The James is the third-largest cancer hospital in the country and one of the best in the nation as ranked by *U.S. News & World Report*. With 21 floors and more than 1.1 million square feet, The James fosters collaboration and integration of cancer research and clinical cancer care.

To increase critically needed cancer research funding at the OSUCCC – James, Pelotonia was established in 2008 and has become the No. 2 cycling fundraiser in the country, raising more than \$273 million since its inception. Thanks to the event's major funding partners, every dollar raised by participants goes toward innovative cancer research and initiatives such as the Pelotonia Institute for Immuno-Oncology at the OSUCCC – James.

Research is an integral part of what makes The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center such a force in the global medical community. Our investment in research and commitment to the investigative process has led to many breakthroughs and innovative discoveries. We encourage research at all levels, knowing that the research seeds planted today will yield life-changing results now and in the future.

The Ohio State University has one of the most comprehensive health science campuses in North America — with colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Dentistry, Optometry, Public Health and Veterinary Medicine — adjacent to the tremendous resources and expertise of other university departments. This proximity fosters remarkable collaborations, which makes Ohio State unique in the country in its potential to promote scientific partnerships and the direct translation of research discoveries into new medical therapies and technologies.


The Ohio State University College of Medicine continues to rise in many key areas in the annual Blue Ridge Institute rankings, an independent national analysis of National Institutes of Health (NIH) research funds awarded to colleges and universities. In the most recent rankings (2022), NIH funding to the College of Medicine increased by 4.8% — much greater than the 1.4% average given to other colleges and universities in the top 20.

With research centers dedicated to cancer, heart and lung disease, behavioral medicine and more, plus more than 140 shared core labs, we foster collaboration and shared resources that maximize grant dollars and time to discovery.

On the horizon is our new multidisciplinary research tower. This state-of-the-art facility will bring together researchers and scientists from disciplines across Ohio State — from the College of Medicine to Biostatistics to Biomechanical Engineering — to work within a truly collaborative and interactive environment. The goal is to shorten the time from initial research to new discoveries in treatment options, improving and ultimately saving patient lives.


College of Medicine

For more than 100 years, The Ohio State University College of Medicine has combined innovative medical education with cutting-edge research and science-based patient care.

We're proud of what we've accomplished and of our impact on the changing face of medicine. Our leaders have charted a course for the future as we continually evolve to meet ever-changing demands in medicine.

The Ohio State College of Medicine is consistently ranked 28th among medical schools in the United States and among the top 15 public universities. The college's innovative curriculum places students in clinical settings from the start of their first year. We're one of the few schools in the world to offer five dual medical degrees: MD/PhD, MD/MBA, MD/JD, MD/MHA and MD/MPH. Our School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences offers degrees in athletic training, health sciences, medical dietetics, radiologic science, respiratory therapy and physical therapy.

More than 80 accredited graduate and residency programs train more than 1,000 residents and fellows each year. In addition, users in approximately 150 countries access our web-based continuing medical education training programs each year.



Designing spaces for the future of health care delivery

With a goal of strengthening the focus on interdisciplinary curriculum that matches the way health care professionals will practice and face challenges in the real world, we're opening the new home of the College of Medicine, the Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Center, in 2024. This \$157.3-million project includes a 120,000-square-foot renovation of Hamilton Hall and construction of a new 100,000-square-foot building featuring flexible facilities to serve multiple disciplines. It will also create a collaborative campus for interprofessional education throughout the health sciences, including Dentistry, Nursing, Optometry, Pharmacy, Public Health and Veterinary Medicine.

Our hospitals

Across the university, we're paving our bold, innovative path forward by building the campus of the future to support teaching, learning, research and patient care. This extraordinary undertaking includes the expansion of our premier academic medical center.

Brain and Spine Hospital: Specialized units for stroke care, traumatic brain injuries, spinal cord injuries, chronic pain and more.

Dodd Rehabilitation Hospital: Home to our acclaimed inpatient program specializing in stroke, brain and spinal cord rehabilitation.

East Hospital: Blends the friendly atmosphere of a community hospital with all the advantages of a major medical center.

Harding Hospital: The most comprehensive psychiatric and behavioral health services in central Ohio.

James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute: The third-largest cancer hospital in the country and the only freestanding cancer hospital in central Ohio, with satellite clinics such as the Stefanie Spielman Comprehensive Breast Center and The James Outpatient Care, which has central Ohio's only proton therapy center.

Richard M. Ross Heart Hospital: The nation's first hospital dedicated to cardiovascular care.

University Hospital: Our flagship facility, home to the region's most advanced intensive care units.

Our central Ohio facilities

Beyond our seven hospitals, the Ohio State Wexner Medical Center has nearly 100 facilities across central Ohio to provide convenient patient access and the space needed for the most technologically advanced research, teaching and patient care possible, including a network of primary care, outpatient and urgent care facilities, as well as dedicated specialty facilities for sports medicine, ENT and more.

Building the future

Our new inpatient hospital, scheduled to open in 2026, is the largest single facilities project ever undertaken at Ohio State. It's designed to enhance a unified Ohio State Wexner Medical Center campus providing world-class patient care, leading-edge research and outstanding clinical training.

- 820 large, private rooms to elevate patient-centered care, nearly doubling the number of beds we have today
- Enhanced connections between the new inpatient hospital and the OSUCCC – James
- More than half an acre of terrace space and a quarter acre of green space for a small park
- 148 additional beds for patients of the OSUCCC – James
- 51 neonatal intensive care unit bassinets
- State-of-the-art diagnostic, treatment and inpatient service areas; imaging; operating rooms; and critical care and medical/surgical beds



Pelotonia Research Center

This five-story research center, which opened in 2023, advances the university's strategic plan and framework with state-of-the-art laboratories serving multiple research disciplines, including biomedical, life sciences, engineering and environmental sciences. In addition, two floors are dedicated to the OSUCCC – James, including a second home for the OSUCCC – James Pelotonia Institute for Immuno-Oncology and a new home for the OSUCCC – James Center for Cancer Engineering.



Ohio State Outpatient Care Facilities

Starting in 2021, Ohio State began to expand our outpatient care footprint around central Ohio to bring world-class care to the community setting. State-of-the-art facilities offering comprehensive care have opened in New Albany and Dublin, along with our most recent facility, The James Outpatient Care, which expands access to our nationally ranked cancer team.



Putting equity and inclusivity into practice

Embracing diversity

Our Diversity Council is a volunteer-led group of employees who create events and education offerings to train our own faculty, staff and learners on bias and systemic racism and provide tools to grow and change.



Fostering diverse, inclusive workplaces

Our employee-led Resource Groups provide peer support, mentoring and professional and personal development for employees in several identity and interest groups including veterans, LGBTQ+, Black faculty and staff, Hispanic/Latino and many others.



Supporting the health and wellness of our community

As a land-grant institution, we hold a special responsibility to take care of our Ohio communities.

Traveling to our patients

The Ohio State Community Care Coach visits underserved communities to offer walk-in care from a mobile team of professionals including doctors, nurses, social workers and other health care professionals. The OSUCCC – James has two mobile units that regularly go into communities across Ohio to offer the latest digital mammography technology to women who may lack access to important preventive care.



Celebrating health

We host an annual Healthy Community Day event with live music, family activities, free food, health screenings and services. Doctors, nurses, pharmacists, physical therapists, optometrists and stroke and wound care specialists come together to care for anyone who stops by.




Tackling a community epidemic

In the face of a nationwide opioid crisis, we marshal our resources to find solutions. Our campuswide efforts include designing free sessions to distribute naloxone kits to the public and teaching participants how to administer naloxone safely.



Combating infant mortality

Franklin County's infant mortality rate is one of the highest in the nation, with Black babies dying at twice the rate of white babies. It takes an entire community to save our infants, so we're committing substantial professional and volunteer support to the cause.
