



# Bravo pH medication information

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Talk to your provider before your Bravo pH test about all of the medicines you are now taking, including over the counter and prescription medicines, and vitamin and herbal supplements.

Your provider may ask you to stop taking some of these medicines.

## Seven days before your test

You will need to stop taking the following medicines unless directed otherwise by your provider. If you do not stop these medicines seven days before the test, the test will have to be rescheduled.

These medicines include:

- dexlansoprazole (Dexilant)
- esomeprazole (Nexium)
- lansoprazole (Prevacid)
- omeprazole (Prilosec)
- omeprazole and sodium bicarbonate (Zegerid)
- pantoprazole (Protonix)
- rabeprazole (Aciphex)

## Three days before your test

You will need to stop taking the following medicines:

- cimetidine (Tagamet)
- famotidine (Pepcid)
- nizatidine (Axid)

You may take antacids, such as Alka-Seltzer, Gaviscon, Gelusil, Maalox, Milk of Magnesia, Mylanta, Roloids, Pepto-Bismol, Tums, and others, up until the *evening before the test*.
